TEACHING

I have a strong record of teaching in a wide variety of courses both large and small. My teaching evaluations are consistently high. I was nominated for the campus-wide Academic Senate Distinguished Teaching Award at UCSB in 2013.

I consistently teach large introductory courses such as "Introduction to Global Studies" and "Global History, Culture and Ideology." I have also taught a required annual "Research Methods" course at the graduate level. Other teaching experience includes "Honors Research," "Global Economy and Development," "Global Media," "Global Inequalities" and "Ethnographies of Globalization." In sociology I taught "Classic and Contemporary Social Theory," "Social Psychology," "Criminology" and "Juvenile Delinquency," among other courses.

From the beginning of my academic career I have been committed to developing new and exciting classes, curriculums and pedagogies in the fields of Anthropology, Sociology and Global Studies. My experience in this area includes participation in curriculum development grants, the use of new technologies in the classroom, as well as designing entirely new degree programs at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. My most recent publications focus on defining what the new field of Global Studies is, how to develop new curriculums for the field, and how students can go about doing global research.

As part of my ongoing commitment to increasing diversity at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, I developed and taught a course titled "Research and Writing for Graduate School." As a designated honors instructor, I found that the traditional honors courses tended to have GPA and other requirements that made these courses less accessible to first generation scholars, particularly those from underrepresented populations. In contrast, my "Research and Writing for Graduate School" classes were designed to appeal to students that might not be sure about graduate school. As a result, this course tends to draw a much higher ratio of first generation and underrepresented students. The course has been very successful in helping underrepresented students develop research projects that have been essential as writing samples in their graduate school applications. Many of my former students have received fellowships and scholarships, enabling them to attend prestigious professional and graduate programs.

In terms of graduate education I have led the curriculum development for the new PhD Emphasis in Global Studies (starting Fall 2019). I have also led the curriculum development for the proposed doctoral

program in Global Studies (planned for Fall 2020). At the graduate level, in 2018 I co-authored a proposal for a self-supporting MA in Globalizing Education that was reviewed by graduate division and underwent market research. The market research indicated an extremely high national and international interest among a diverse range of respondents.
